

Corpus Christi International Airport - KCRP, Texas for FSX

This is fictional scenery for KCRP, Corpus Christi International Airport, Texas designed for FSX. I brought this airport up to date because it had been added on to and approaches changed since FSX was developed.

Corpus Christi International Airport (IATA: CRP, ICAO: KCRP, FAA LID: CRP) is a city-owned public-use airport five nautical miles (9 km) west of the central business district of Corpus Christi, in Nueces County, Texas, United States.

Corpus Christi International Airport covers an area of 2,457 acres (994 ha) at an elevation of 44 feet (13 m) above mean sea level. It has two asphalt paved runways: 13/31 is 7,510 by 150 feet (2,289 x 46 m) and 18/36 is 6,080 by 150 feet (1,853 x 46 m).

For the 12-month period ending May 31, 2013, the airport had 70,456 aircraft operations, an average of 254 per day: 32% military, 18% general aviation, 15% air taxi and 3% scheduled commercial, At that time there were 68 aircraft based at this airport: 37% single-engine, 25% multi-engine, 6% jet, 1% helicopter. United Express and Southwest Airlines often use the airport as a diversion station in case of weather problems in Houston.

Corpus Christi International Airport is classified as a Commercial Service, Primary, Nonhub Airport. For Corpus Christi International to have a classification as a Commercial Service Primary Airport it must be a public airport with scheduled passenger service and must have an enplaned passenger count of at least 10,000 annually. The designation as a Nonhub Airport means that Corpus Christi International enplanes at less than .05 percent of the total annual U.S. passenger enplanements. No airlines currently use Corpus Christi as a connecting hub airport.

These are the revisions made:

- Reposition runways more accurately using Google Earth.
- Add Blast Pads to runways.
- Rename Runway 17-35 as 18-36
- Brought all approaches and waypoints up to date using Feb. 2018 approach plates.
- Restructured all taxiways.
- Added night lighting to the ramp areas.
- Added to airport property to accommodate new taxiways.
