This is a representation of Northway Airport (PAOR). Northway Airport (IATA: ORT, ICAO: PAOR, FAA LID: ORT) is a state owned, public use airport serving Northway, a community located in the Southeast Fairbanks Census Area of the U.S. state of Alaska.[1] It is included in the National Plan of Integrated Airport Systems for 2011–2015, which categorized it as a general aviation facility.

During World War II for northbound Lend-Lease aircraft on the Northwest Staging Route, the flight strip at Northway was the first stop in the Territory of Alaska.

Northway Airport covers an area of 1,150 acres (465 ha) at an elevation of 1,715 feet (523 m) above mean sea level. It has one runway designated 5/23 with an asphalt surface measuring 5,100 by 100 feet (1,554 x 30 m).

For the 12-month period ending December 31, 2005, the airport had 15,800 aircraft operations, an average of 43 per day: 73% general aviation, 25% air taxi, and 2% military.

Here are the changes made to this airport:

- > Removed default buildings and added buildings that look more appropriate for this airport.
- > Reorganized parking.
- > Added ramp area lighting.
- > Added turn-around pads at each end of the runway.
- > Changed runway designations from 04-22 to 05-23 based on current charts.
- > Added Terminal Waypoints and corrected incorrectly located waypoints according to current approach charts.
- > Modified RNAV approach to correspond to current approach charts.
- > Added GPS approach to correspond to current approach charts.
- > Added landclass scenery to represent town of Northway.
- > Added Helipad.
