

St Paul Island, Alaska for FSX

This is a representation of St Paul Island Airport Alaska (PASN). St. Paul Island Airport (IATA: SNP, ICAO: PASN, FAA LID: SNP) is a state-owned, public-use airport located on St. Paul Island in the Aleutians West Census Area of the U.S. state of Alaska. It is situated near the city of St. Paul, the island's main settlement. Scheduled airline service to Anchorage International Airport is provided by Peninsula Airways (PenAir).

As per Federal Aviation Administration records, this airport had 3,301 commercial passenger boardings (enplanements) in calendar year 2008, an increase of 8% from the 3,064 enplanements in 2007.

St. Paul Island Airport has one runway designated 18/36 with an asphalt surface measuring 6,500 by 150 feet (1,981 x 46 m). For the 12-month period ending December 31, 2006, the airport had 410 aircraft operations, an average of 34 per month: 63% air taxi, 24% military and 12% general aviation.

Here are the changes made to this airport:

- > Removed default buildings and added buildings that look more appropriate for this airport.
- > Reorganized parking.
- > Added ramp area lighting.
- > Moved entire airport to correct coordinates per charts.
- > Lengthened the runway and paved with asphalt based on current airport information.
- > Added Terminal Waypoints according to current approach charts and corrected existing waypoint locations.
- > Modified GPS and RNAV approaches to correspond to current approach charts.
- > Added landclass scenery to represent the Village of St Paul.
